

Dear friends

I hope that you have all had a good break during the summer holidays, even if you have not actually managed to get away. For me there have been several highlights within our parish life.

The retreat at Fox Hill, Frodsham was a blessing to all who went. For many, it was the first time that they had been on a retreat. The beautiful surroundings, time to connect with God through creation, the worship and services, the food, fellowship and faith made it a time of rest and spiritual refreshment for all of us.

Staycation was another highlight. Monday saw us enjoying the beauty of Hollingworth Lake followed by fish and chips at Mr. Thomas. There were so many of us that we had two sittings. On Tuesday 47 of us set off by coach to Gorton Monastery. We had an excellent talk about the monastery followed by lunch together. There was also the opportunity to explore the building after having eaten. On Wednesday St. Margaret's Bowling Club hosted a taster bowling session for us. We were worried about the weather, but for the most part, it held off. A big thank you to the members of the Bowling club who tried to teach us the basics of crown green bowling. There were some naturals within our group – but I am not one of them! We were blessed by beautiful weather for our trip to Southport on the Thursday. Lunch, an amble down Lord Street, a walk down the pier and back, a carousel ride for some of us and ice creams meant that a good time was had by all. The weather was not so good for Ramsbottom on the Friday, but we managed to avoid most of the heavy downpours by being on the steam train, visiting the sights and eating lunch. Overall 141 attended the events throughout the week, with 75 different people, including non-church members. It was a very good week. If you have any ideas for trips and ideas for Staycation 4 next year – please let me know.

We have our Parcivall retreat coming up, which I am sure will be enjoyed by all.

So, what have we got coming up in September and October?

We have a confirmation service on Sunday 8th September in our main 9.45am service, where we have six candidates either being confirmed or received into the Church of England, plus one candidate who will also be baptised. Please do come along to support of candidates in the next stage of their journey of faith.

As you know, this is our year of 'Celebrating Creation' As part of this we are having an eco-week which will be launched by Bishop David at the 9.45am service at St. Margaret's. During the week schools will be invited to partake in a range of practical eco-friendly activities. We will be exploring water and its usage, fair trade. Food and vegetarian cookery, reducing the use of plastic and climate change. The activities will include art/craft work, discussions, cookery and science experiments. On Friday 4th August St. Margaret's School Harvest will take place. We have our usual Harvest lunch on the Saturday from 12.00-1.30pm. Before and after this the church will be open. There will be some displays about being environmentally friendly and of some of the children's work. Eco week will conclude with our Harvest festival on the Sunday and a pet service in church in the afternoon, where there will be the opportunity for you to bring your pet to church for a blessing. It should be an interesting day!

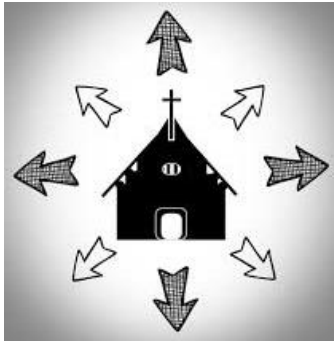

Ecoweek September 29th to October 6th

Greta Thunberg is amazing. At just 16 years old she has looked the climate crisis in the face and has decided to do something about it. Millions of people are listening to her, taking note and following her example. For young people climate change is threatening their futures – the catastrophes that are predicted if we carry on as we are will be in their lifetime. So, for our

week of focus on creation we are going to involve the children in our local primary schools. We plan to have 7 stations around the church so that children can spend 10 minutes at each station learning about an aspects of climate

change before they move on to the next station. We will invite the primary schools in our parish to come to church for the experience. On Saturday 5th October church will be open during the harvest lunch and afterwards to display the work we have been doing with the children. Local eco organisations will be invited to come along to publicise their activities.

But that is not all. On Michaelmas Sunday, September 29th, we will have a service focusing on eco themes, to launch the week. Bishop David will preach and October 6th will be our harvest service. So, our activities will be firmly held within the context of prayer and worship.

It looks like being a varied and exciting week, but to make it work we will need volunteers, both people to help with each station, and others to make tea to keep the workers going! Could you spare a couple of hours once or more during the week? Details will be on the notice sheet nearer the time. Join us in putting St Margaret's on the Prestwich eco map!

Autumn Days – E White (1925-2011)

This is a well-established favourite of our Sunday School! I think the children would choose to sing it every week if they could, but they are strictly limited to autumn only. The tune jauntily takes the singers through a list of experiences, not all of them autumnal, with a regular reminder to say, "thank you".

Although Estelle White was a well-respected and prolific hymn writer, this is not an overtly religious song. Check the text:

1. Autumn days when the grass is jewelled
and the silk inside a chestnut shell,
jet planes meeting in the air to be re-filled,
all these things I love so well

*So I mustn't forget,
No, I mustn't forget,
To say a great big thank-you,
I mustn't forget.*

2. Clouds that look like familiar faces,

and a winter's moon with frosted rings,
smell of bacon as I fasten up my laces,
and the song the milkman sings.

3. Whipped-up spray that is rainbow-scattered,
and a swallow curving in the sky,
shoes so comfy though they're worn-out and they're battered,
and the taste of apple-pie.

4. Scent of gardens when the rain's been falling,
and a minnow darting down a stream,
picked-up engine that's been stuttering and stalling,
and a win for my home team.

We are encouraged to take a moment to sniff the air, to look around and see the details, to hear the sounds and to taste the harvest. No smartphones, no cameras or social media to filter our world view. Be in the moment. Be thankful for it. Protect it.

This month our church will be hosting it's first EcoWeek. We will be inviting 7-9 year-olds from local schools to visit and participate in a range of activities that will encourage them to develop awareness of how we are all responsible for the care of the natural world. There are currently *7.7 billion* people sharing space on our planet. If we each make a few small changes, there will be big differences.

St Margaret's' will be open before and after the Harvest Lunch on Saturday 5 October so that you can look at the displays of the children's work, and be inspired to #DoYourBit too.

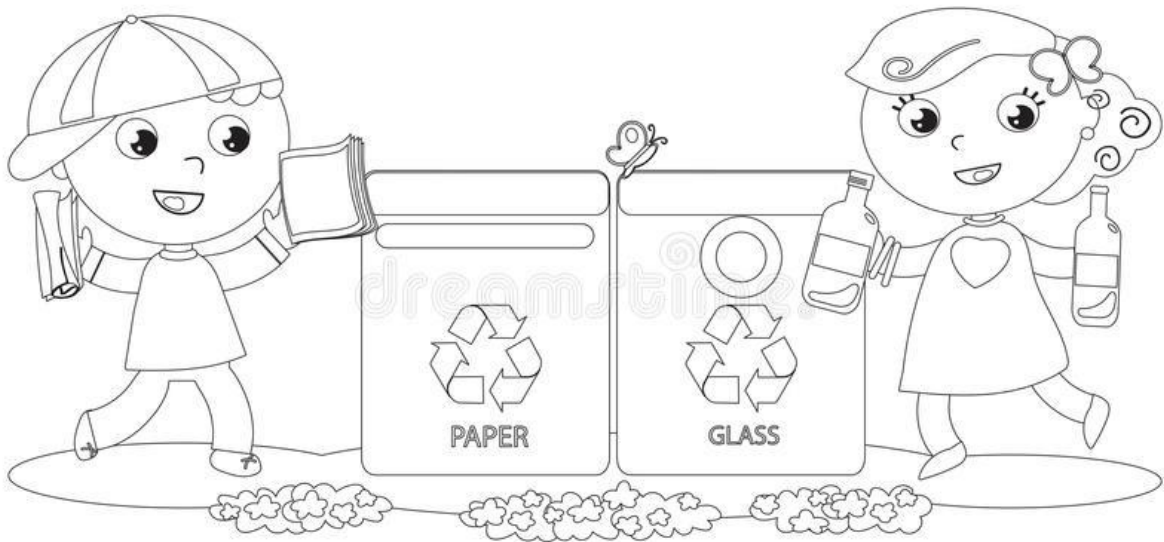
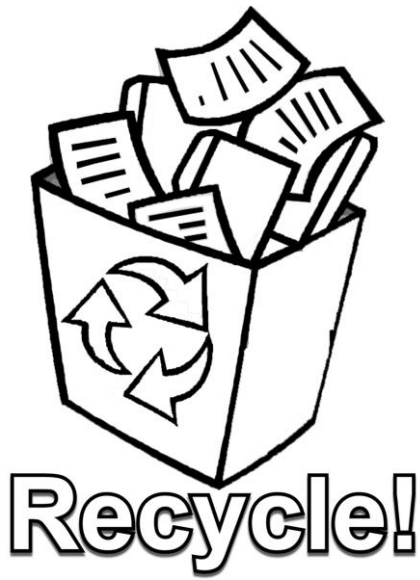

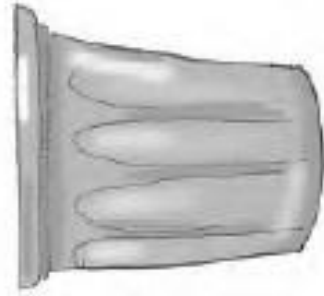
